DISTINGUISHED SENIOR PAST GRAND MASTER MOURNED



The Masons of Alberta lost one of their most distinguished brothers when M.W. Bro. William Ireland passed away after a lengthy illness on March 8, 1980 at the good age of 92 years. At the Grand Lodge Communication in 1965, the Grand Master presented M.W. Bro. Ireland with a scroll which reads:

TO OUR TRUSTY AND WELL BELOVED BROTHER WILLIAM IRELAND

Born in New London, Connecticut, July 16th, 1887. Initiated in Perfection Lodge No. 9, Calgary, January 12th, 1912. Worshipful Master of Perfection Lodge No. 9, 1918. Grand Registrar, Grand Lodge of Alberta A.F. & A.M. 1927-28.

Acting Grand Secretary 1928, elected Junior Grand Warden 1941. GRAND MASTER, GRAND LODGE OF ALBERTA, A.F. & A.M. 1944-45. Member of the Board of Benevolence from 1928 to present

date. President 1934 to 1941 and from 1955 to present date. Chairman, Committee of Scrutineers, 1946 to present date.

Auditor for Grand Lodge from 1919 to present date. Deeply appreciative of your devotion to the cause of Freemasonry in the Jurisdiction of Alberta, your Brethren in Grand Lodge, assembled for the Sixtieth Annual Communication, wish to tender you their thanks and to express the hope that you will long be spared to receive Masonic Wages in terms of the high regard and deep affection of us all.

This in itself indicates the high regard in which this Mason was held by his brethren. He continued as President of the Board of Benevolence until 1971 and a member of the Board until 1974. In 1971 he retired as the Chairman of the Committee of Scrutineers after twenty-five years in that position. He continued as auditor until 1968. In addition he was a member of the Scottish Rite and a Past Provincial Grand Master of the Royal Order of Scotland.

In private life he was a chartered accountant and a Life Member of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Alberta. In his community work he was President and member of the Board of the Rehabilitation Society of Calgary for the Handicapped and an active member of Wesley United Church for thirty years.

To list his accomplishments in Freemasonry and other areas cannot possibly record the affection his brethren felt for him. His encouragement and advice to successive Grand Masters is beyond description. The spirit of kindliness and brotherhood which motivated his actions will not soon be repeated in this Jurisdiction.

Masons mourn this loss and give thanks for this life. They extend to Mrs. Ireland and the family sympathy and their gratitude for having shared the time of the husband, father and grandfather with them.

The M.W. the Grand Master, W. N. Love, a number of Past Grand Masters, past and present Grand Lodge Officers and members of Perfection Lodge No. 9 attended the memorial service held in Wesley United Church, Calgary on March 11. Reverend C. Leighton Streight, the minister of the church officiated.

75th ANNIVERSARY COMMUNICATION GRAND LODGE OF ALBERTA

at Red Deer, Alberta. June 13-14, 1980

Most Brethren are aware that the Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge of Alberta is to be on the 13th and 14th of June. But perhaps not all are aware of the uniqueness of this particular meeting. It embodies two special features....something that has never happened before, and something that will never happen again.

In the former case, the meeting will be held in Red Deer (at the Capri Hotel) for the first time in history. This host city is in the very heart of the jurisdiction and the pleasant change of venu may just add a little spark to the whole Communication.

The thing that will never happen again is the celebration of the 75th Anniversary of our Grand Lodgea full year of observance beginning in June.

There is to be no great change in our format this year. The banquet takes place on Friday evening beginning at 5:00 p.m., with Grand Lodge opening at 9:00. Hopefully, this portion will conclude early to permit an hour or so of pleasant Masonic sociability. We only get together in full strength once a year!

Saturday morning at 8:00 o'clock sharp Grand Lodge reconvenes to continue the serious business of the Craft. If all goes well, business will be completed by the noon break for the luncheon. Installation of new officers begins at 1:30.

One of the highlights of the Communication will be the address given at the banquet by R.W. Bro. the Hon. Donald M. Fleming, P.C., Q.C. Brother Fleming is an experienced and knowledgeable Mason as well as a powerful speaker, and since the banquet is restricted to Masons (as is the Saturday luncheon), we can look forward to a proper Masonic address and a message specifically tailored for Craft Masons alone.

It should be stressed that the investment and installation of the new Grand Master will officially signal the beginning of the 75th Anniversary year for the Grand Lodge of Alberta. And to set the tone for the year, the Communication will conclude with a brief memorial and thanksgiving service.

Therefore the presence of officers of every Lodge is of particular significance this year. It has offtimes been a cause for dismay when many Lodges are not represented by any of their three senior officers; attendance at the Grand Communication is one of their specific duties. It is they who help determine the course of the Craft in the next 75 years!

What a wonderful thing it would be if we had 100% representation of Lodges in this jurisdiction at Red Deer. See that your Lodge does its part from the very beginning.

I, personally, look forward to seeing you, Brethren, in Red Deer.

HON. DONALD M. FLEMING, P.C., Q.C., B.A., LL.B., D.C.L., LL.D., K.C.L.J.



Hon. Donald M. Fleming will be the guest speaker at the Grand Lodge Banquet in Red Deer on June 13. He is a distinguished Canadian and is known as having served in the House of Commons for many years. As Minister of Finance from 1957 to 1962 and Minister of Justice from 1962 to 1963 he became well known throughout Canada.

His association with Freemasonry began with his initiation into Ionic Lodge No. 25 G.R.C. in 1937 and he served that Lodge as its Worshipful Master in 1951. In 1955 he was elected Grand Junior Warden of the Grand Lodge of Canada in the province of Ontario. (From 1965 to 1968 he was a member of the Board of General Purposes of the Grand Lodge). The Royal Victoria Lodge No. 443, Nassau, Bahamas received him as an affiliate in 1975.

The record of his membership in concordant bodies both in Canada and in Nassau is extensive. At present he is the Chaplain of the Royal Victoria Council, Allied Masonic Degrees in Nassau.

The Grand Lodge of Alberta will be honoured to receive this outstanding citizen and Mason at its Seventy-fifth Communication. His address at the banquet will undoubtedly be one of the most memorable in our history.

It was judged that he had attended more regular Masonic communications than any other member, rarely missing a regular meeting. He attended district conventions, Masonic Workshops, and took part in many interlodge visitations. He was, in brief, a staunch supporter of all Masonic activities.

In the words of the R.W. Bro. Bown, "The 50 Year Jewel is an emblem of recognition of faithful and distinguished service to his Lodge."

In keeping with the occasion of the presentation of the 50 Year Jewel to Bro. Maxwell, and the official visitation of the D.D.G.M., the meeting was an exceptional one with 44 members of the Fraternity in attendance and nine lodges represented by visiting Brethren.

The meeting was concluded with refreshments and an enjoyable social hour.
