AUSTRALIAN TOUR

On the 2nd of March, 1989, eighteen Masons from Alberta and British Columbia together with many of their ladies, departed for a 3 week tour of Australia and New Zealand. It can be safely stated that everyone present had a great trip, one filled with outstanding memories.

The mechanism which triggered the tour was the 100th Anniversary of the United Grand Lodge of Victoria and these celebrations were held in Melbourne featuring the Grand Installation followed the next evening by the Grand Master's Banquet.

All of us were enormously impressed with the ceremonial work displayed by the members of that jurisdiction, especially the Grand Director of Ceremonies. We were equally proud to watch the ranking representative of the Grand Lodge of Alberta, Canada, R.W.Bro. Len Wathen of Strathmore (D.D.G.M., District 16) presented with musical fanfare and ceremonial escort and welcomed by the M.W. Grand Master who invited him to be seated in the east with the other dignitaries representing some 26 jurisdictions throughout the world.

It is interesting to observe that while the installation was held in the National Tennis Centre before 16,000 people (a public installation), the banquet was exclusively for Masons while the ladies were invited to a banquet and fashion show at another location.

An edited, one hour long VHS video cassette was brought back to Alberta from which a number of copies are being produced for many of those who were present. No doubt you will have an opportunity over the next while to see this impressive event. It was a pleasure to have been there.

KLONDIKE LODGE

Once again the Klondike Lodge will be held in Edmonton on July 28 at 7:30 pm at the Lodge Hall in Fort Edmonton Park under the charter of Saskatchewan Lodge No. 92 with assistance from all the lodges in District 12. Your attendance would be most welcome.

CONSECRATION

An event rarely seen in the Jurisdiction is the Consecration of a Lodge. There will be such an event, subject to approval of Grand Lodge, in September of this year.

On September 23 at King George Masonic Temple, 2323 Osborne Road S.W. Calgary, LOYALTY LODGE NO. 197 will be consecrated by the Grand Master and will become a fully fledged Lodge of this Jurisdiction. The ceremony is ancient and meaningful and those brethren who have not previously seen it performed should make every effort to attend. ANSWER TO THE APRIL QUESTION OF THE MONTH

The purpose of the Historical Register is clearly defined in the Constitution (520(b)), but is unfortunately not maintained by some lodges. The defined purpose is: to contain the names of the Charter Officers and Members; to have the Roll of Past Masters and an annual list of Elected and Appointed Officers; to hold the HISTORY OF FORMATION AND PROGRESS OF THE LODGE; to have the Bylaws contained therein and the signatures of members to those bylaws; the membership roll and the names of rejected candidates.

It is clear that not only is the Historical Register the key history of any lodge, it can be a source of information and inspiration if it is in the hands of a well skilled brother.

- MASONIC TOUR OPPORTUNITIES -

Following a memorable & enjoyable tour of Australia & New Zealand, a number of suggestions have been made about destinations for subsequent tours that not only would be exciting, but would provide an opportunity to include some international Freemasonry. One of the more important results of such tours is the friendships that are begun among our own. It is a very special experience.

Consequently a list of tours is shown below that are in the preliminary stage of development. Each has its own special flavour and for each there is shown a brief description, potential Masonic content, approximate cost and tentative time frame.

Should 1 or more of these tours be of interest you, please indicate on the reverse side and return it to the address shown. More complete information will then be forwarded to you.

THE ORIENT (3 weeks)-Hong Kong, Bangkok & Singapore including a day into mainland China. In Hong Kong & Singapore you may visit a Scottish, Irish or English constitution lodge. This tour should go in mid-Feb/1989. Cost about \$3,500 per person including all airfares and hotels plus all breakfasts.

AUSTRALIA/N.Z. (3 weeks)-Not a repeat of this year's tour, rather a look at Perth, Adelaide, Hobart, Sydney, Melbourne and northern New Zealand. The occasion is the centenary of the G.L. of Tasmania. Mid-Feb departure & cost around \$3,700.

ALASKA/YUKON (2+ weeks)-4 day cruise between Alaska & Vanc. preceded by a land tour of Whitehorse, Dawson & Fairbanks with Masonic visits possible at each and perhaps on board ship. This tour could go as early as Sep. 1989 or Sep./1990. Cost approximately \$2,800.

SWITZERLAND/RIV. (3 weeks)-Arrival in Geneva, through Albertville(1992 Olympics) to the Riviera then through the Italian lake region to Switzerland with a possible 4 day Mediteranean cruise from Monte Carlo. This will be a May/1990 tour costing \$3,800 dependant upon the cruise. If the cruise is waived the cost will be less.

ISRAEL-Your input is necessary here. If there is sufficient interest I will pursue it further and check it personally. The Masonic opportunities are obvious. No dates or costs established until I have your indications.
